Request for Easter Flowers

We will have an eclectic display of flowers for the Altar Guild to use. Please do not bring fresh cut flowers in vases that have water.

You may bring your donation Thursday and Friday of Holy Week during Katie's office hours or in the evening when you come for worship, and Saturday morning no later than 10am when the Altar Guild will be working to prepare the church for our Resurrection Celebration.

Easter Offering Designation 2023

Each Easter, the Vestry designates the Easter Offering to agencies that assist those in need. The tradition is to donate half to a National or International Organization and one local.



This Easter one half of your Easter Offering will go to support the amazing work of World Central Kitchen. This grassroots organization, whose mission is to be first to the frontlines providing fresh meals in response to crises, has been doing amazing work around the world for 13 years. They were first on the ground and continue to be in Ukraine when the war started, they have fed people in all the domestic weather tragedies as well as responding to the Earthquakes in Syria and Turkey.

The second half of your Easter offering will be designated to the Discretionary Fund of the Congregation (Rector's Discretionary Fund). This fund supports primarily local people who are in need financially for utility, food, clothing, gasoline, and medicine assistance. During the absence of a Rector, the Vestry will designate someone to manage this confidential fund in order to continue this manner of outreach to our community. We get many calls a week and do the best we can to be helpful.

To contribute to the Easter Offering, make a check out to St. Timothy's, with 'Easter Offering' in the memo. If donating cash, please use an envelope with Easter Offering on the outside – include your name if you would like your contribution registered for your taxes. We will leave this opportunity open through April in order for you to have an opportunity to give.

More about WCK: *Founded in 2010 by Chef José Andrés, World Central Kitchen (WCK) is a nonprofit organization that is first to the frontlines providing fresh meals in response to crises, while working to build resilient food systems with locally led solutions. Applying our model of quick action, leveraging local resources, and adapting in real time, WCK has served more than 300 million nourishing meals around the world.*

When disaster strikes, WCK's Relief Team mobilizes with the urgency of now to start cooking and serving meals to people in need. By partnering with organizations on the ground and activating a network of local restaurants, food trucks, or emergency kitchens, WCK serves comforting meals to survivors of disasters quickly and effectively. 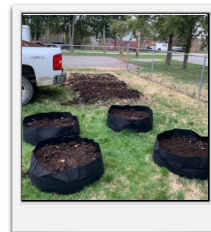
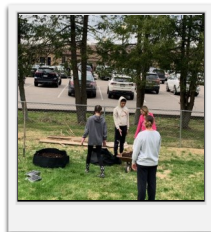
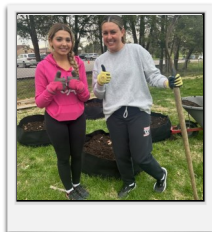

Woman's Dinner and a Book Group

Now that Spring has finally sprung we are hoping that more ladies will join us at the next Women's Dinner and a Book Group meeting on **Thursday, April 20th at 6:30pm** in the Garrett Fellowship Hall. For April we have chosen "Her Hidden Genius" by one of our favorite authors Marie Benedict who specializes in stories about women who have made remarkable achievements but get overlooked when it is time for the accolades.



Here's a bit about the book from the Amazon website:

"She changed the world with her discovery. Three men took the credit.

Rosalind Franklin has always been an outsider - brilliant, but different. Whether working at the laboratory she adored in Paris or toiling at a university in London, she feels closest to the science, those unchanging laws of physics and chemistry that guide her experiments. When she is assigned to work on DNA, she believes she can unearth its secrets.

Rosalind knows if she just takes one more X-ray picture - one more after thousands - she can unlock the building blocks of life. Never again will she have to listen to her colleagues complain about her, especially Maurice Wilkins, who'd rather conspire about genetics with James Watson and Francis Crick than work alongside her.

Then it finally happens - the double helix structure of DNA reveals itself to her with perfect clarity. But what unfolds next, Rosalind could have never predicted.

Marie Benedict's powerful new novel shines a light on a woman who sacrificed her life to discover the nature of our very DNA, a woman whose world-changing contributions were hidden by the men around her but whose relentless drive advanced our understanding of humankind."

There are several copies of the book in available at both the Kanawha and Putnam/Cabell county libraries. You can also find it in paperback at your favorite online or in person bookstore.

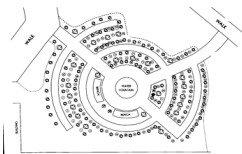

End of Life Planning

Death finds us all eventually. We can't prevent it, but we *can* direct how we'd like our final days to unfold. End of Life planning is about making thoughtful choices now, putting them into a written advance directive and discussing those choices with others. These plans help to ensure that we get the care we want and avoid what we don't want, even if we're unable to speak for ourselves. We are preparing packets for end of life planning and encourage those of us who may not have plans in place to seriously consider doing so. We are also in the very early stages of planning a workshop for those who would like some assistance. More information will be made available soon!
