Grow Church



Grow Church is a congregational development program in partnership between the Diocese of West Virginia and the Diocesan Church Development Institute (DCDI). It is a leadership training program focused on developing the spiritual community and organizational life of congregations. It equips leaders to serve their congregation through a highly integrated training experience that engages participants in the issues and dynamics that they face as leaders. DCDI is a program for clergy and lay leaders who desire to transform their congregations by making them stronger, healthier, more deeply rooted in Anglican Spirituality, more responsive to God, and more effective in their communities.

Grow Church is a two-year program that gathers four times per year (eight times over two years) for overnight meetings around the Diocese. Programming kicks off Friday morning and runs through Saturday midday, with participants departing in the early afternoon following lunch.

St. Timothy's will have a team of three consisting of Andy Bird, Cathy Slep Branam, and Kitty Byus for this first year of meetings. If anyone is interested attending the next round of meetings, likely beginning in the Fall of 2024, please contact the office!

Woman's Dinner and a Book Group

Some changes are in store for the next meeting of the Women's Dinner and a Book Group in November! We will be starting our meetings earlier at **6:00pm** and the date will be on the final Thursday of the month, **Nov. 30th!** We will still be gathering as usual in the Garrett Fellowship Hall. Our final book for 2023 will be "The First Ladies" by one of our favorite authors, Marie Benedict.



This novel is about the extraordinary partnership between First Lady Eleanor Roosevelt and civil rights activist Mary McLeod Bethune--an unlikely friendship that changed the world. The daughter of formerly enslaved parents, Mary McLeod Bethune refuses to back down as white supremacists attempt to thwart her work. She marches on as an activist and an educator, and as her reputation grows she becomes a celebrity, revered by titans of business and recognized by U.S. Presidents. Eleanor Roosevelt herself is awestruck and eager to make her acquaintance. Initially drawn together because of their shared belief in women's rights and the power of education, Mary and Eleanor become fast friends confiding their secrets, hopes and dreams--and holding each other's hands through tragedy and triumph.

When Franklin Delano Roosevelt is elected president, the two women begin to collaborate more closely, particularly as Eleanor moves toward her own agenda separate from FDR, a consequence of the devastating discovery of her husband's secret love affair. Eleanor becomes a controversial First Lady for her outspokenness, particularly on civil rights. And when she receives threats because of her strong ties to Mary, it only fuels the women's desire to fight together for justice and equality.

This is the story of two different, yet equally formidable, passionate, and committed women, and the way in which their singular friendship helped form the foundation for the modern civil rights movement.

There are several copies of "The First Ladies" at both Kanawha and Putnam/Cabell county libraries in various formats. You can also find it at your favorite online or actual bookstore.
