# 2017 Episcopal Youth Event

The 2017 Episcopal Youth Event will welcome more than 1300 youth, adult mentors, workshop leaders, speakers, and volunteers from across the Episcopal Church to Oklahoma City, OK. EYE 2017 is geared for youth in grades 9-12 during the 2016-2017 academic year and their adult leaders and is being held in partnership with the Episcopal Diocese of Oklahoma, July 10-14, on the campus of the University of Central Oklahoma, Edmond.

The theme of EYE17 is "Path to Peace", grounded in the Beatitudes as found in Matthew's Gospel and is intended to serve as a call for participants to focus on peacemaking and the ways each member of the Episcopal branch of the Jesus Movement can pursue a path to peace.

EYE17 marks the 13th EYE and remains a popular and well-attended event. The group traveling

from the Diocese of West Virginia includes Alex Ward and Andy Bird from St. Timothy's.

Summer is heating up and so is the book that the Women's Dinner and A Book Group is reading, *The Keeper of Lost Things* by Ruth Hogan. The meeting will be held on Thursday, July 20, at 6:30 p.m. in the Garrett Fellowship Hall.

A charming, clever, and quietly moving debut novel, it is full of endless possibilities and joyful discoveries that explores the promises we make and break, losing and finding ourselves, the objects that hold magic and meaning for our lives, and the surprising connections that bind us. Lime green plastic flower-shaped hair bobbles—Found, on the playing field, Derrywood Park, 2nd September. Bone china cup and saucer—Found, on a bench in Riveria Public Gardens, 31st October.

Anthony Peardew is the keeper of lost things. Forty years ago, he carelessly lost a keepsake from his beloved fiancée, Therese. That very same day, she died unexpectedly. Brokenhearted, Anthony sought



consolation in rescuing lost objects—
the things others have dropped,
misplaced, or accidently left behind—
and writing stories about them. Now,
in the twilight of his life, Anthony
worries that he has not fully
discharged his duty to reconcile all the
lost things with their owners. As the
end nears, he bequeaths his secret
life's mission to his unsuspecting

assistant, Laura, leaving her his house and all its lost treasures. As the Keeper of Lost Objects, can Laura unlock the past and make the connections that will lay spirits to rest?

This book is SO good you'll find it very hard to put down! So, forget about the laundry, blow the dust, and fix yourself a tall glass of ice tea, snag a plate of cookies and lounge in a comfy chair out on your deck. It will certainly be time well spent!

There are several copies of the book available through the Putnam County Library system. Of course, it is available to purchase at your favorite bookseller whether in the mall or online.
