St. Timothy's has long supported the efforts of this phenomenal organization – helping build a school, provide health care and educational services, linking adults with new job training skills, etc. St. Timothy's is one of 4 founding churches for Deep Griha USA, a stateside support organization for Deep Griha Society. 

#### Christian Community Cupboard Update

In 2018 the CCC served 2909 families for a total of approximately 10,000 people. The CCC can no longer accept large – 5lbs or more – bags of flour, sugar, rice, or beans. They are no longer allowed to separate these items into smaller portions due to regulations from USDA who governs the food pantries around the state. So, when buying these items for donation, please purchase 1 and 2 lb. bags.



We continue to be assigned to donate pinto beans and navy beans. However, other items that need stocked are: canned fruit, canned mixed vegetables (please do not purchase green beans or corn, we are overrun with them), pasta, pasta sauce, macaroni and cheese. Toiletry items are also needed since the cupboard no longer purchases anything along those lines. What is needed the most is shampoo (not conditioner) and men's and women's deodorant.

During the month of February, there will be a need for sorting teams each Tuesday. Mardi Gras Casino will deliver a truck each Tuesday that will need to be unloaded and then sorted. If you are available for any of these days, please contact Tina McClung for further information.
