





Tick tock, tick tock and dance around the block! For February St. Timothy's Woman's Dinner and a Book Group will be reading "Clock Dance" by Anne Tyler, a charming novel of self-discovery and second chances from the Pulitzer Prize-winning author of A Spool of Blue Thread. We'll be



meeting on Thursday, February 20th at 6:30pm in the Garrett Fellowship Hall and Trish Fisher will be our hostess for the evening.

Straight from the Amazon website, here's a bit about the book! Willa Drake has had three opportunities to start her life over: in 1967, as a schoolgirl whose mother has suddenly disappeared; in 1977, when considering a marriage proposal; and in 1997, as a young widow trying to hold her family together. So, she is surprised when in 2017 she is given one last chance to change everything, after receiving a startling phone call from a stranger. Without fully understanding why, she flies across the country to Baltimore to help a young woman she's never met. This impulsive decision, maybe the first one she's consciously made in her life, will lead Willa into uncharted territory surrounded by eccentric neighbors who treat each other like family, she finds solace and fulfillment in unexpected places. A bewitching novel of hope and transformation, Clock Dance gives us Anne Tyler at the height of her powers.

There are several copies of the book in various formats at the Western Regional library website (Putnam County) and at the Kanawha County Library. You can also find it at your local bookstore or online. Our hostess Trish Fisher will supply the main dish (which will NOT be KFC this time!).
