Keeping Children Safe During Church

This article is written to all the adults in the congregation, not just parents! Obviously, some of it is specifically addressed to parents and their conversations with their children, but all of us have a responsibility to care for the safety of the children at church. Please read so that we can function as a community that cares.



Safeguarding

One of the things that I love about our congregation is that the children feel very much at home here. They have a sense of ownership. That's how it should be! They wander freely and find places to run and play while adults are talking and hanging out. As the adults we are responsible for their safety. Unfortunately, the world is such that we need to have these conversations. And we need to speak to our children (not in a frightening way) about keeping themselves safe in a variety of situations. I want to ask you to please have this conversation with your children regarding church.

During worship, the only doors that are unlocked are the Welcome Center doors. However, anyone can come into the building through those doors and not be heard or seen while we are worshipping and could hide themselves in the building. I think bathrooms are a good place to hide if your intent is unsavory. Therefore, I am requesting that children not be allowed to leave the worship space or the Children's Chapel to go to the bathroom or get a drink of water without adult accompaniment. (Now this can be difficult if a single parent/grandparent has more than one child to look after! This is where the other adults not looking after children can offer to help or be asked to help) Also, please feel free to use the bathroom in the office off the Welcome Center so that you are not out of worship any longer than necessary. (also great when anyone has to go quickly!)

Secondly, speak to your children about letting you know where they are headed if they are leaving with friends to go play someplace in the building. Any number of times I have heard parents say when they are ready to leave, 'I wonder where my kids are?' Ask the kids to please let you know where they are headed so you can get them when you are ready. As the weather has gotten nice and the playground equipment is soon to be power washed that will be a great space for after church play! Again, if some older teens or an adult could be in the playground when kids are I think we are minding their safety much better. The Children's Ministry Committee will be discussing these items at their next meeting. We also have a committee working on preparedness items and safety is a part of that committee's work. If you have suggestions or ideas please share them with me, Laura Leslie, or Michael Moncada.

Thank you for reading this article and being willing to participate as a whole community in keeping our children safe.





Here's a bit of the Publisher's Weekly review of the book:

From the talented storyteller whose Fried Green Tomatoes at the Whistle Stop Cafe became a beloved bestseller and a successful film comes a sprawling, feel-good novel with an old-fashioned beginning, middle and end. The predominant setting is tiny Elmwood Springs, Mo., and the protagonist is 10-year-old Bobby Smith, an earnest Cub Scout also capable of sneaking earthworms into his big sister's bed. In 1946, Harry Truman presides over a victorious nation anticipating a happy and prosperous future. The effects of changing social mores are handled deftly; historical events as they impact little Elmwood Springs are noted, and everything is infused with the good humor and joie de vivre that are Flagg's stock-in-trade. There are several copies of the book in the Putnam County Library system in book, CD and E-reader formats.
