

We will need to elect 3 new Vestry members for 3 year terms at the Annual Meeting. Those retiring are Janessa Noel, Kim Smith, and Kim Murphy. We thank them for their service. To serve on the Vestry one must be 18 years of age, baptized, worship regularly, and make a financial pledge to the congregation. The Vestry works in partnership with the Rector to oversee the mission and ministry of the congregation, develop and promote vision, and provide for the care of the property and personnel of St. Timothy's. Vestry meetings are once a month (currently after church on the third Sunday of the month). Often, Vestry members are asked to oversee a specific area of the church's ministry (oversee, not DO).

Please consider if you would be willing to serve a term on the Vestry. If you are interested, speak to Andy Bird, Senior Warden or Cheryl Winter, Rector. We look forward to hearing from you! ▼

Refugee Resettlement

An interfaith group in Charleston has been working with Episcopal Migration Ministries to become a place where Syrian refugees can be resettled. EMM has approved Charleston as a site and looks to help resettle 100 refugees in 2017. This is only the second time in 5 years that a new city has been approved by EMM. One of the unique aspects of this request was the truly ecumenical and interfaith nature of the support in Charleston.

Our Bishops have called together all the Charleston area Episcopal Clergy to discuss this new ministry opportunity on January 10. I will have more information regarding what will be needed and how we as a congregation might support this ministry after this meeting. If this is an area of ministry that you might like to connect with, please let me know.

Please keep this ministry in your prayers. Not everyone thinks this is a good idea (although refugees have been being resettled in the Charleston area for decades through other means). Already there is some resistance. And you may have doubts, questions, or concerns. Let's do our best to keep an open mind and learn about what this might mean for our diocese and our region. Women's Dinner & A Book

Come start 2017 by reading a good book and then visiting with the St. Timothy's Women's Dinner & A Book Club to enjoy some good food, warm fellowship, and a lively discussion of this month's book! The WD&BG will be meeting on Thursday, January 19th, at 6:30 p.m., in the Garrett Fellowship Hall to discuss Leaving Time by Jodi Picoult.

Here's a review of the book found on the Amazon website: Throughout her blockbuster career, Jodi Picoult has seamlessly blended nuanced characters, riveting plots, and rich prose, brilliantly creating stories that "not only provoke the mind but touch the flawed

souls in all of us" (The Boston Globe). Now, in her highly anticipated new novel, she has delivered her most affecting work vet.

For more than a decade, Jenna Metcalf has never stopped thinking about her mother, Alice, who mysteriously disappeared in the wake of a tragic accident. Refusing to believe she was abandoned, Jenna searches for her mother regularly online and pores over



the pages of Alice's old journals. A scientist who studied grief among elephants, Alice wrote mostly of her research among the animals she loved, yet Jenna hopes the entries will provide a clue to her mother's whereabouts.

As Jenna's memories dovetail with the events in her mother's journals, the story races to a mesmerizing finish. A deeply moving, gripping, and intelligent pageturner, Leaving Time is Jodi Picoult at the height of her powers.

Several copies of the book in regular and large print are available through the Putnam County/ Western Regional Library System along with a CD version for those who would rather use their ears instead of their eyes! You can also find it at local book stores and as an E-book to read on your Nook, Kindle, or other electronic device at the online shops.

We are in need of highchairs and strollers. We also need baby lotion, diaper rash cream, baby wash, and shampoo.

Thank you for all your support. Without it we would not be doing as well. Please spread the word that we are open on Mondays from 12-2:00 p.m. We help pregnant women and children through age two with diapers, car seats, cribs, and other miscellaneous items. There is no income requirement. It is based on need. Our outreach covers Hurricane, Teays Valley, and Scott Depot.
