

Women's Dinner & A Book

Now that the busyness of clearing away the traces of summer, putting up the harvest fall, and sweeping leaves away from walks has come to a close it is time to relax a little before Thanksgiving and Christmas rushes start! Come and visit with the St. Timothy's Women's Dinner and A Book Club, and clear out your mind with some good food, warm fellowship, and a lively discussion about another interesting book! The WD&BG will be meeting on **Thursday, October 27, at 6:30 p.m.,** in the Garrett Fellowship Hall to discuss *All the Light We Cannot See*, a Pulitzer Prize winning novel by Anthony Doerr.

This book is a beautiful, stunningly ambitious instant New York Times bestseller about a blind French girl and a



German boy whose paths collide in occupied France as both try to survive the devastation of World War II. Marie-Laure lives with her father in Paris near the Museum of Natural History, where he works as the master of its thousands of locks. When she is six, Marie-Laure goes blind and her father builds a perfect miniature of their neighborhood so she can memorize it by touch and navigate her way home. When she is

twelve, the Nazis occupy Paris and father and daughter flee to the walled citadel of Saint-Malo, where Marie-Laure's reclusive great-uncle lives in a tall house by the sea.

In a mining town in Germany, the orphan Werner grows up with his younger sister, enchanted by a crude radio they find. Werner becomes an expert at building and fixing these crucial new instruments, a talent that wins him a place at a brutal academy for Hitler Youth, then a special assignment to track the resistance. More and more aware of the human cost of his intelligence, Werner travels through the heart of the war and, finally, into Saint-Malo, where his story and Marie-Laure's converge.

Several copies of the book in regular and large print are available through the Putnam County/ Western Regional Library System along with a CD version for those who would rather use their ears rather than their eyes! You can also find it at local book stores and as an E-book at the online shops.

However, we plan to form a committee to consider long term visioning and planning for St. Timothy's before we proceed with any definite plans.

Well, that is a good question - so glad you asked. For those of you who may not know, the Fletcher property is adjacent to the playground on which the one story house sits. We used to have our offices in there until the old furnace gave up a couple of years ago when we were struggling financially. That is when we moved the offices into the church. In addition to the furnace, the house is in fairly bad repair.

The Vestry has gotten the property surveyed and appraised and in August received permission from the Bishop and Standing Committee to put the property up for sale. In the mean time we began thinking that we might pause a bit before we rush to sell. We need to think about the future needs of this congregation and do some more visioning and planning before we move ahead. One thing we know for sure is that we need more fellowship space! But we also need offices. And what kind of outside

fellowship space do we want? How else do we want to minister to the community through our facility? These are all things that we need to talk about.

If you would be interested in being a part of a VISIONING TASK FORCE please speak to Cheryl ASAP. Particularly important for this group is to have representation from our families who have young children. You all will (God willing) be here longer than many of us. Please consider offering your wisdom. We do however want a broad spectrum of the congregation too. Long-timers - WE NEED YOU TOO! We would like to have the first gathering of this task force in November!

Becoming Pilgrims

A Silent Retreat

Your diocesan Commission on Spirituality invites you to join fellow pilgrims for a silent retreat November 10-13, at Bishop Hodges Pastoral Center, which overlooks the Tygert Valley in Huttonsville, West Virginia. With the center's 1400 acres of land there are opportunities to hike rugged terrain or well-maintained paths and immerse ourselves in God's creation.

According to the *Merrriam-Webster Dictionary*, pilgrims are travelers on a journey to a holy place. Holy places are most often physical destinations. However, this pilgrimage is an intentional, inward journey turning our hearts and souls toward God through silence, worship, and renewal.

Arrival is open to Thursday or Friday and departures Saturday afternoon or Sunday, with the retreat officially ending after lunch on Sunday. Group sessions, led by the Rev. John Valentine, begin Thursday evening and run through Sunday morning.
